From the Agent



Recipe of the Month: Easy Granola Bars



With a busy schedule, it's hard to find foods that are yummy and easy to make. This granola bar recipe is on of my favorites!

Ingredients:

- 2 cups of quick oats
- 1 cup of peanut butter
- 2 tablespoons of sliced almonds
- ¼ cup of honey
- ¼ cup raisins or dried cranberries (optional)

Directions:

- 1. Mix together ingredients in a medium-sized bowl.
- 2. Line a 9x9 square pan or 7x11 rectangular pan with parchment paper and press the granola into the pan until evenly distributed.
- 3. Place pan in freezer for one hour into granola is firm. Cut into 14 bars.
